## **Introduction**

## **Qualification Description**

This qualification provides a trade outcome in scaffolding operations in the residential and commercial construction industry.

Our qualification is different from many offered in the market place. In packaging the elective units we have included those skills that we see as essential for a scaffolder operating at the intermediate level and also favoured by employers, comprising of many High Risk Work Licence activities which will assist you in completing your day to day activities. These also provide pathways into many other roles within the construction industry.

## **Qualification Packaging**

CPC30911 Certificate III in Scaffolding consists of 13 units in total, 9 core and 4 elective as outlined below.

### **Core Units**

- CPCCCM1012 Work effectively and sustainably in the construction industry
- CPCCCM1013 Plan and organise work
- CPCCCM1014 Conduct workplace communication
- CPCCCM1015 Carry out measurements and calculations
- CPCCCM2001 Read and interpret plans and specifications
- CPCCWHS2001 Apply WHS requirements, policies and procedures in the construction industry
- CPCCSC2001A Safely handle and use scaffolding tools and equipment
- CPCCLSF2001A Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding basic level
- CPCCLSF3001A Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding intermediate level

### **Elective Units**

- CPCCCM2001B Work safely at heights
- CPCCCM3001 Operate elevated work platforms up to 11 metres
- CPCCLDG3001A Licence to perform dogging
- TLILIC0003 Licence to operate a forklift truck

### **Additional Units**

Due to the method of delivery and the way in which our learning resources have been developed, some of the units have been clustered with other alike units of competency in the construction and mining industries. At no additional cost or increase in training time you will also receive the following three units of competency:

- RIIHAN301E Operate elevating work platform
- TLILIC0005 Licence to operate a boom-type elevating work platform (boom length 11 metres or more)
- RIIWHS204D Work safely at heights

### **Assessment**

The majority of the units of competency will be assessed individually and one holistically while completing other units within the qualification. Students will be assessed by demonstrating the applicable performance and will also be required to answer a number of written questions regarding their actions and theoretical application of knowledge. Assessments will be completed in the workplace or in another environment that accurately simulates the workplace. The assessor will actively set tasks for the student and observe these tasks being performed.

To standardise the application of this qualification, the assessment tasks (performance evidence) are based on those specified in the individual units within the Qualification, CPC30911 Certificate III in Scaffolding. Assessors will apply an assessment procedure to ensure you are ready for the assessment and have the right resources and equipment to achieve the right outcome.

### **Course Materials**

Learner training is supported through the provision of quality learning materials and resources.

### **Course Conduct**

The duration for the course is 312hrs which typically can be completed in 12-24months.

Many of the units are completed as standalone which aids in the scheduling and means that you are able to use the individual skills in your workplace as you attain them i.e. Forklift, Dogging etc.

### **Entry Requirements**

As many of the units of competency are associated with a High Risk Work Licence, there are specific requirements which must be met. The individual standalone course brochures provide for more detailed information on specific requirements. Common requirements are:

- Learners must be aged 18 years or older
- Photo Identification is required to be sighted prior to course commencement
- Language, literacy and numeracy skills required to interpret work instructions, equipment operating instructions and to complete a written hazard / risk assessment and record work outcomes

### **Clothing Requirement**

- Learners must be dressed in their normal work clothing (high Vis) and be wearing steel capped footwear
- Learners must be alert and physically capable of driving safely

### **Fees and Charges**
