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Introduction

Integral Skills is a Registered Training Organisation (RTO number 45528) registered with the Australian Skills Quality Authority. Integral Skills is proud to offer training in CPCCSF4001 Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding advanced level.

Course Description

This course applies to those who are required to perform Scaffolding activities as part of their role.

It is the last of the three different levels of scaffolding.

HRWL DEFINITION - NSW SafeWork

Scaffolding work is the erection, alteration or dismantling of a temporary structure erected to support a platform from which a person or object could fall more than four metres from the platform or the structure.

All intermediate scaffolding work plus scaffolding connected with the use and operation of:

- Cantilevered hoists
- Hung scaffolds, including scaffolds hanging from tubes, wire ropes or chains
- Suspended scaffolds

Note: advanced certificates cover the requirements for the intermediate certificates; intermediate certificates cover the requirements for the basic certificates.

Mode of Delivery

Delivery of this course will be trainer led and delivered over five days of face-to-face training in a classroom setting combined with skills practice and assessment in a simulated work environment.

Clothing Requirement

Learners must wear covered shoes or work boots and hard hat.

Where a learner does not wear covered shoes they will not be able to participate in the course due to work health and safety concerns.

Assessment Summary

The assessment in support of the unit of competency requires the learner to complete a written knowledge assessment and then demonstrate their applied knowledge and skills during a practical assessment performing Scaffolding at an advanced level, observed by the assessor. The learner must answer all the written knowledge questions correctly. There is the opportunity for this knowledge assessment to be conducted verbally if the learner requires this level of support.

The practical assessment is conducted under controlled conditions in a simulated workplace. The learner will be briefed on the assessment which will involve identifying hazards, erecting scaffolding structures (suspended, cantilevered hoists etc) and monitoring workplace hazards while communicating with others in the workplace.

It is important to note that following the completion of the competency assessment, the learner will return on day five of the course where they will have the opportunity to complete the high-risk work licensing assessment relating to Scaffolding Advanced (licence class SA). Whilst Integral Skills organise and meet the cost of an approved SafeWork NSW licenced assessor to

conduct this licensing assessment, this assessment process is conducted according to the requirements of SafeWork NSW.

This two-step assessment process is conducted by separate assessors as it is important to maintain the separation and integrity of both the competency-based assessment and the high-risk work licensing assessment.

National recognition

On successfully completing the training/assessment you will be issued a Statement of Attainment issuing you the unit of competency: CPCCLSF4001 Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding advanced level. This is the unit of competency not the HRWL (authority to do the work).

This unit of competence is nationally recognised and provides individuals with a valuable outcome that is recognised throughout Australia.

The issuance of the unit of competency will provide you an important part of the eligibility criteria to obtain a Scaffolding Advanced license. Please refer to the section “Scaffolding Advanced - licencing with SafeWork NSW” for more information of the licensing process.

Course Materials

Learner training is supported through the provision of quality learning materials and resources. Learners should attend the course in comfortable appropriate work clothing with steel capped boots. Learners should have their own scaffolding belts and equipment by this stage and should also bring these to the course, consumables are supplied as part of the course.

Pre-Requisites/Entry Requirements

- Must have either successfully completed the unit CPCCLSF3001 Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding intermediate level or holding a valid licence for intermediate scaffolding and be able to produce it.
- Learners must be aged 18 years or older.
- Photo Identification is required to be sighted prior to course commencement
- Language, literacy and numeracy skills required to interpret work instructions, equipment operating instructions and to.
- Learners must be dressed in their normal work clothing and be wearing steel capped boots.
- Requirements for SafeWork HRWL Assessment:
 - Have an active MyServiceNSW account
 - Be able to access your MyServiceNSW account as part of the enrolment process on day one of the training
 - Be able to complete Proof of Identity (POI) verification via your MyServiceNSW account on the day
 - Have a valid and active email account that they can access during the training to receive a unique Assessment Enrolment Number (AEN) – you can not be assessed without this number

Scaffolding Advanced - licencing with SafeWork NSW

You need a high-risk work licence if you want to perform Scaffolding in NSW (see definition). The training and assessment delivered in this course only relates to the high-risk work licence **class SA**.

Eligibility criteria for a Scaffolding Advanced licence with SafeWork NSW

To obtain a Scaffolding Advanced licence with SafeWork NSW, you will need to present SafeWork NSW with evidence that you:

- At least 18 years of age.
- have completed HRW training with a registered training organisation (RTO) in the appropriate class or classes
- have been assessed as competent in the class by a SafeWork NSW accredited assessor working for the RTO and been sent your NSA
- be able to use English at a level that enables high risk work to be carried out safely.
- You should note that a licence fee **will** apply to your application for a high-risk work licence. This fee is **not** covered within the course enrolment fee. The application fee is outlined in the SafeWork NSW list of fees and charges ([click](#)).
- Can use English at a level that enables the safe performance of high risk work.

Steps to obtain a Scaffolding Advanced licencing with SafeWork NSW

Once you have completed this course, it will be up to you to apply for your high-risk work licence for Scaffolding Advanced. The following steps apply to obtain a new Scaffolding Advanced licence with SafeWork NSW:

- Select an approved RTO that delivers the unit of competency CPCCSF4001 Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding advanced level.
- Enrol and pay the required enrolment fee with the RTO and successfully complete the competency-based training and assessment for the unit of competency CPCCSF4001 Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding advanced level.
- Must have your Assessment Enrolment Number (AEN) for class SA, you apply via your Services NSW Application ([click](#)) and follow the instructions.
- Complete the mandated high-risk work assessment with an approved high-risk work assessor for licence class SA. This high-risk work assessment will be facilitated by Integral Skills as part of the five-day delivery. The high-risk work assessment will not be conducted by the trainer but by a different assessor as required by SafeWork NSW.

- On successful completion of your HRWL assessment, the assessor will finalise the assessment online and you will receive an email – follow the instructions to apply for your HRWL.
