Introduction

Course Description

The course is comprised of five individual units of competency but centred around two primary units – Enter and Work in Confined Spaces and Work Safely at Heights, with the other three units complementing and being required to perform the task safely.

To access many confined spaces (drains, silos, vats, tanks etc), vertical entry is required and hence the need to also work at height. With this in mind, while conducting any task i.e. entering the confined space, the worker needs to evaluate and control all possible hazards/risks including testing the atmosphere for harmful contaminants all whilst working under the permit for the confined space entry.

With all these activities required to complete the task safely, they are done concurrently, creating a symbiotic relationship.

The course has been designed this way in a cluster of units to provided end to end training whilst maximising the learners time.

This course prepares learners to undertake the assessment and on successful completion, obtain a Statement of Attainment in the units of competency identified and leave 'Work Ready' knowing they have the knowledge and ability to perform the task safely.

Assessment Summary

The learner will be assessed by demonstrating knowledge and skills applicable to these units. They will be required to answer a number of written questions regarding the theoretical application of knowledge, followed by practical activities, working in teams putting that knowledge into practice.

This assessment must be conducted by an RTO assessor and will be completed in the workplace or in another environment that accurately simulates the workplace. The assessor will set scenarios/tasks for the learners and observe these being performed.

To standardise the application of this assessment, the assessment tasks (performance evidence) are based on those specified in the Units of Competency. The assessor will use an assessment instrument mapped to the assessment requirements of the Units of Competency, combined with their knowledge and experience to ascertain competence.

Course Conduct

On arriving, learners will complete any outstanding enrolment administration and then participate as a group gaining the theoretical knowledge. Once the theory component is complete, we then put what is learnt into practice via the practical component. Although the practical activities are completed in work teams, there is sufficient time for one-on-one training for those requiring it. At Integral Skills we provide a friendly and supported environment to learn and achieve.

Mode of Delivery

Delivery of this course will be trainer led and delivered over one day of face-to-face training in a classroom setting combined with skills practice and assessment in a practical training area.

Pre-Requisites/Entry Requirements

- There are no qualification pre-requisites for this course.
- Learners must be aged 15 years or older (may be asked to provide ID to confirm).
- Language, literacy and numeracy skills required to interpret legislative requirements and to undertake written and practical assessment activities (Read, write and understand English).
- All course materials will be provided by Integral Skills.

Clothing Requirement

Appropriate job site clothing for the task i.e. enclosed footwear, hard hat if owned, shorts and T Shirt (non-offensive slogans etc) as a minimum and no singlets or thongs. Where a learner does not wear appropriate clothing they will not be able to participate in the course due to work health and safety concerns.
